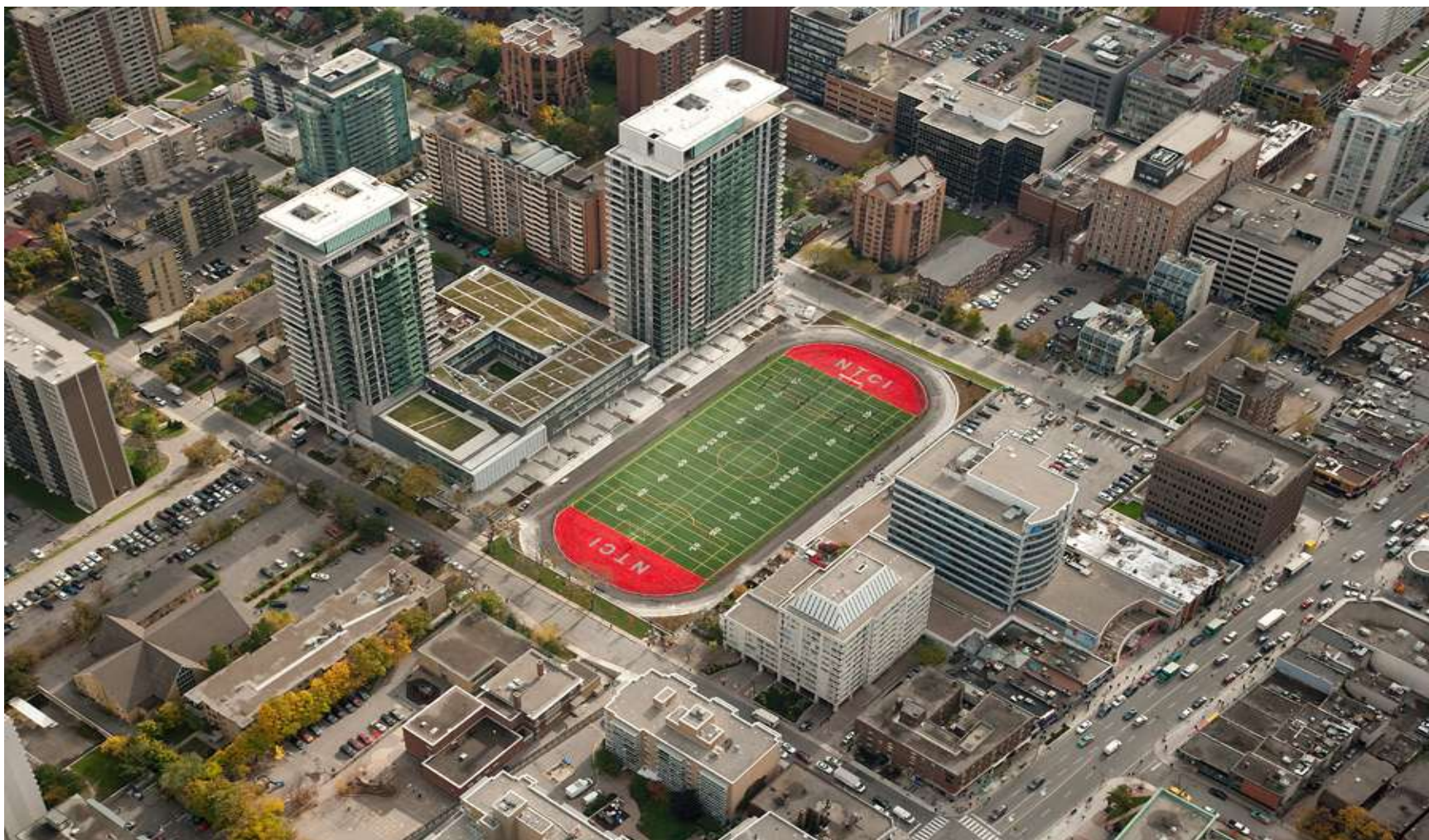

## NTCI HERITAGE COURT

This NTCI Heritage Court celebrates the legacy of the school from its founding to the opening of this building. North Toronto High School was founded in 1910 in the Town Hall at Yonge Street and Midland Avenue. By 1912 a two-storey North Toronto Collegiate Institute (NTCI) was built on the present site, facing north onto Broadview Avenue. A two storey south wing was added in 1921 with stone arches forming two new entrances on Broadview Avenue. In 2010 the new NTCI replaced the original building, parts of which are preserved in the Heritage Court. The NTCI Foundation, representing the school's 8000 alumni, provided these heritage elements to the building, including this plaque.

The original building's front (east) entrance archway, divided by two large windows, has been reclaimed and is now part of the Heritage Court's south wall. Arches from the 1921 addition on Broadview Avenue have also been reclaimed and stand back-to-back over the entrance to the Court. The Court's walls incorporate red bricks from the original NTCI building. The inscribed paving stones commemorate notable teachers, students, teams and achievements.

NTCI's first nine Principals are remembered here: George Wood (1912-23), Colonel F.H. Wood (1927-43), W.S. Moorman (1943-50), B.B.H. "Bud" Page (1950-70), Cam Rosenhan (1970-77), Jim Hogarth (1977-89), G.D. Strach (1989-99), Arthur Williamson (1999-2006) and the current Principal, Joel Greenleaf (2006- ).
